Retired consultant anaesthetist, Dr John Crowhurst will explore the use of thiopentone (Pentothal®) anaesthesia 'events' during the Japanese attack on US Military bases at Pearl Harbour in December 1941. Some of the more than 1,000 casualties who required emergency surgery and anaesthesia, received intravenous Pentothal® anaesthesia, with devastating consequences in the severely shocked trauma patients. Many died.

Tour - Adelaide Desalination Plant

Adelaide's Desalination Plant has the capacity to supply up to 100 billion litres of water a year. After an overview of the desalination processes at the adjoining Kauwi information centre we board a bus for a guided tour around the plant, which spans 32 hectares. If the plant is not running, we may also have access to the inside the plant.

After the tour you may like to further explore the area with a 1.2km walk from the Kauwi centre which includes various lookout points with interpretive signage about plantlife and the Aboriginal people, seating and wonderful views of the coastline. In the local Kaurna language, Kauwi means 'fresh water'.

Alternatively, nearby Hallett Cove Conservation Park has interesting walks, picnic places and café, is one of the best known geological sites in Australia and known throughout the world.
